

## The General Data Protection Regulations In House Training

## Introduction

The new General Data Protection Regulations represent the biggest change in UK data protection law in 20 years.

They contain numerous significant, serious and complex changes to the way that businesses of all types are expected to collect, manage and use personal data.

They require businesses to assess, analyse and in many cases significantly change what data they collect, how they collect it, how they care for it, who they allow to access it and who they pass it onto.


All of these changes need to be analysed and implemented by 25 May 2018. There is no transitional period.

The penalties for breaching the new laws will be severe, potential fines of up to €20 million or 4% of an organisations group worldwide turnover as well as the introduction of criminal offences for individuals breaching key provisions of the legislation.

May 2018 may seem a way off but the planning that needs to go into integrating data protection into your organisation means that a smart business will act now to make themselves fully aware of the implications of GDPR and start planning for it now.
